## Rising Prayers, Falling Grace; an Interactive Liturgical Art Installation

As a Worship and Arts Director at a Presbyterian church in Peoria, IL, I am always in search of how to integrate visual art into the worshiping life of the community I serve. Interactive liturgical art has been something I have been very excited about lately. I use this term to describe visual art that functions liturgically and is constructed (at least in part) by the worshiping community. In the wake of our Easter celebrations, I would like to tell you about an installation I did a few years back for Pentecost.

Throughout Eastertide (the Great 50 Days) we are led through the work of the Holy Spirit as the Church of Christ takes form. The season of Eastertide leads up to the celebration of Pentecost. The most significant symbol of Pentecost is the flame; indicating the showering upon of God's people with the power and gift of the Holy Spirit. Most times, we visualize the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as a descending motion. God sends us the Spirit of God's self, showering us with divine presence. But I believe there is also a movement upwards where humanity becomes better equipped to share the love of Christ through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. With God's presence we are affirmed in the goodness of what it means to be human and made in God's image. During Pentecost we rejoice in God's gracious offering of the Holy Spirit, but we also rejoice in the fact that our communities of faith are the ones who are responding to God's Spirit.

In an attempt to visually aid us in this understanding, I coordinated an art installation for the Sunday of Pentecost. As an extension of the Prayers of the People, everyone from the church was invited to participate in this project. During fellowship hour after our weekly worship gathering, there was paper and writing utensils on each of the tables in the fellowship hall. People were instructed to write down prayers on these red and white colored pieces of paper. Following this, I provided instructions on how to fold the paper into a very simple origami bird. Since some of our older members and younger children were unable to successfully create the origami shape, youth from the church met together to form the prayer requests into the origami shape.

After hundreds of papers had been filled out, I suspending the origami birds in the sanctuary from the catwalk as a symbol of God's gifting of the Holy Spirit and the community's prayers rising heavenward. The installation was named "Rising Prayers, Falling Grace".

After the season of Pentecost was over and the installation was taken down, there was a further honoring of these prayers. A handful of people from the church took the folded birds outside of the building on the church grounds for a burning ceremony, which functioned as another symbol of our prayers rising like incense (see Psalm 141:2).
